

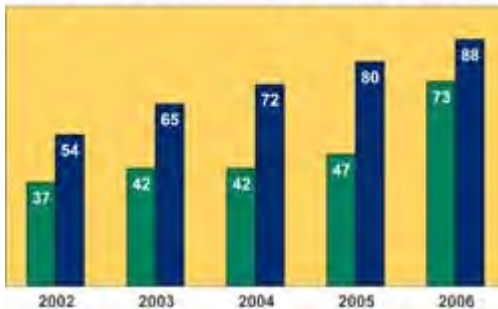


**Chevron Selects Moore Student for Conference**
